After 35 years as CEO and President of CCMU, Mark Manton announced his plans to retire on July 19th, 2024.

During his time at CCMU, Mark helped shepherd the fledging school through the 1990s with his long-time partners George Kitchie and Shi Cheng. Mark and George led CCMU through its initial ACAHM accreditation for the MSTCM degree in 2000 and the MAc degree in 2011. After George retired in 2018, Mark led the CCMU BOD, Administration, Academic Leadership Teams, and Department Faculty to add three doctorate degrees and a Research Department complete with an Institutional Review Board (IRB).

Warm-Needle Acupuncture Improve The Degenerative Knee Osteoarthritis

A clinical trial investigated whether warm needle acupuncture could improve the treatment of degenerative knee osteoarthritis alongside conventional medications. Researchers at Nanchong Hospital of Traditional Chinese Medicine and Chuanbei University of Medicine divided 130 patients into two groups: warm needle acupuncture and pharmaceutical control.

Warm-needle acupuncture (WA) is a therapy in which acupuncture and moxibustion are combined by stimulating acupoints with needles whose handles are affixed with burning pieces of moxa.
