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Sample Location Scoring Template Design Documentation

Prepared by Colorado Chinese Medicine University

Purpose

This Sample Location Scoring Template is designed to help acupuncture graduates evaluate the feasibility of opening a Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) clinic in different ZIP Code areas across Colorado. The template provides a structured and data-driven approach to scoring each location based on key demographic, socioeconomic, and practitioner distribution factors.

The methodology reflects a balance between market potential, healthcare demand, and competitive saturation, allowing for evidence-based decision-making when selecting clinic locations.

Scoring Model Overview

Each ZIP Code is evaluated based on eight core dimensions. Each dimension contributes a weighted score to a final composite score (score_v7), which represents the relative attractiveness of the ZIP Code for clinic establishment.

Eligibility: Only ZIP Codes with a total population of 10,000 or more are included in the scoring process to ensure sufficient population base.

Final Score Calculation

The final score score_v7 is calculated using the weighted sum of each component:

score_v7 =
 0.10 × score_population_density +
 0.10 × score_total_female_population +
 0.15 × score_percent_bachelors_degree +
 0.10 × score_education_absolute_count +
 score_median_household_income (already scaled to 25%) +
 0.10 × score_percent_population_in_poverty +
 score_percent_white (scaled to 5%) +
 0.15 × score_acupuncturist_density

Applications

This scoring model serves as a decision-support tool for:

- Prioritizing clinic location candidates
- Visualizing regional strengths and gaps
- Supporting presentations or funding proposals
- Building heatmaps or dashboards for strategic planning

It can be further expanded by incorporating:

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- Rent and lease rates
- Business zoning data
- Public transportation access
- Cultural alignment and insurance plan penetration

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


Appendix: Key Heatmap Visualizations Based on Scoring Results

To assist with visual interpretation of the sample location scoring results, the following five heatmaps are included as part of this guidance document:

• A. High-Potential ZIP Codes (Total Score > 60)

This statewide heatmap displays ZIP Codes that achieved a total composite score above 60. These areas reflect strong combinations of favorable demographics, household income, education levels, and low acupuncturist saturation—ideal candidates for TCM clinic placement.




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• B. Denver County

A detailed view of ZIP Code performance within Denver County, Colorado's most populous urban center. This map helps identify intra-city variability in location feasibility.




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• C. Boulder County

Known for its educated and health-conscious population, Boulder County is mapped to explore localized potential for integrative and preventive medicine offerings.




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• D. Fort Collins (Larimer County)

This map focuses on ZIP Codes around Fort Collins, a growing city with significant student and professional populations.




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E. Colorado Springs (El Paso County)
